B. Call the Meeting to Order

Mr. Ramirez called the meeting to order at 4:06pm.

II. Ice Breaker / Rompehielos

Mr. Ramirez led a general ice breaker specifically to ask those in attendance to take a moment and consider responses to the prompt, What can we do at home to help improve test scores?

III. TEACH Statistical Information / Información estadística de TEACH

A. TEACH Statistical Information / Información estadística de TEACH

Mr. Ramirez shared statistical information for each of our TEACH campuses.

Mr. Ramirez shared information, compiled by Mr. Gomez for TEACH Academy, where 2024-25 iReady Reading information still showed a 71% of students, a significant number who remain three or more grade levels below their intended scores. On the other side of the placement spectrum, currently, 5% of students, a low number are mid or above grade level for their intended scores. 2024-25 iReady Math information shows similar totals where 67% of students, a significant number who remain three or more grade levels below their intended score. On the other side of the spectrum, currently, 4% of students, a low number are mid or above grade level for their intended scores.

Mr. Ramirez also shared SBAC scores, compiled by Mr. Du, Assistant Principal, from TEACH Prep that shows strong improvements in testing within the past year. Mr. Ramirez compared 2023-24 SBAC Data with 2024-2025 totals. The data shows that for standards for ELA, the percentages increased from 11.54% to 29.41%. For standards for Math, the percentages increased 8.65% to 32.35%. Mr. Ramirez thanked our elementary school in bridging important learning gaps within one academic year. This is particularly important with a renewal year for the campus this year. Mr. Ramirez also shared various notes

which assisted to explain growth with greater detail. Strategies that worked during the past year included productive after school tutoring sessions, continuous data talks with students regarding the importance of SBAC, i-Ready and other platforms, consistent Saturday school sessions for test preparation and parents assisting with i-Ready, Achieve 3000 information and general encouraging students to read more.

Mr. Ramirez finished by sharing testing information compiled by Dr. Garcia, instructional coach, regarding TEACH Tech High School. This fall, students have shown math improvements in their testing within their first NWEA benchmark scores. This is one of three benchmarks regarding NWEA within the academic year. The campus encourages families to continue to share the importance of these tests to their children. Mr. Ramirez shared the particular importance for 11th graders that is specifically connected to university admissions.



Students Assessed/Total: 466/467



Overall Placement




The 11th grade test at the end of the year is the most important because it is connected to university admissions. If a student scores a 3 or 4, it increases their chances of being accepted to a 4 year university. We are working hard to prepare students to test through tutoring, extra practice, and digital platforms. Math is very important in everyday life, but we make efforts to ensure they can perform well at the college level. Many students have struggled with math in the past, this is why our program seeks to build both their confidence and skill level.
